Coberths four negroes on the same list viz-Jane Armstrong David Armstrong Jun'r Rosetta Armstrong and Betty Armstrong and that she saw the above named negroes in their possession and under guard and that she hath never seen them since; and a few Days after a Negro man by the name of Hopewell sometimes called himself hopwell Bourne the property of H.
