A negro man named Monday aged 30 the
Slave of Jacob Freeland was taken on
board of a British ship of war on or
about the 24 October 1814 when lying
in the chesapeake [sic] bay opposit [sic] sharps island
in the state of Maryland –

Then personally appeared [sic] Jacob Freeland
before me the subscriber a Justice of the
peace of the state of Maryland in and
for calvert county and made oath on
the holy evangetist of almighty God
that the above negro man named Monday
aged 30 years was his property at the
time he was taken on board of a British
ship of war as above stated

Then came Thomas J Wilson aged about 23
years and made oath on the holy evangely of almighty
God, that on Sunday evening being the 23rd of October
1814, he saw a negro man belonging to Mr. Jacob Freeland
named Monday who had Mr. Martha Wilsons Jinny
for a wife, which he believes the said man went off
to the British then lying off sharpe Island with the
Slaves of said Martha Wilson on Monday morning being
the 26th of October 1814 –

There came Edward Wilson aged about 30
years and made oath on the holy evanjeley [sic] of almighty
God, that on Sunday evening being the 23rd of October

one off [sic] Mrs. Martha Wilson's women named Jinny, which
he believes that the said man went off to the British
then lying of [sic] sharps Island with the slaves of said Martha
Wilson on Monday morning being the 24th of October
1814
