Zachariah Solhoron, living less than a mile from Benedict, aged about forty three years, being duly sworn on the holy evangely of Almighty God, deposeth & saith.

That when the British Army was about to march from Benedict for the City of Washington, he heard an officer speak to a black man by the name of William, who was the property of Doctor Deer [sic] of Calvert County, and who was a ser--jeant in a company of negroes, and asked him (Wm.) if he was not preparing to march. That the sd. black serjeant Wm answered, "No, that – he had been promised the priviledge [sic] of staying that he might get his wife, and that he would have her that night at the risk of his life. The officer, at first, - appeared to have no knowledge of William's having had such promise but after a while appeared to recollect it and the afs'd Serj't Wm was permitted to stay behind, and did go that night and got his wife and also a fellow who the sd. Serj't Wm told the Deponent was brother to his wife – Sworn to this 5th day of Ap'l 1815 Before me
