On page 11 of the British List is found two negroes having the same names with those claimed by Morgan – viz Cheena & Kate – they both seem, first to have entered the Regulus – both are omitted to be entered on her Books – both transferred from her on the 21 Feb 1815 & on the 13 May 1815 both are discharged from the Ceylon at Melville Island – these two negroes appear constantly together & are most likely the same negroes lost by Mr Morgan J Marbury
