Reynold's testimony (if I mistake not) that they came on board of the Enemy together whilst he was A prisoner on board – I contend that the Henry Gantt on page III is the Harry alias Henry Gantt which I claim as trustee for Edward Gantt – which case you will please lay before the board & let me hear the result – I shall given an order in a few days for the amt, of award for N's. & sh'd I be able o get any information in relation to Basil I will enclose it to you -
