On this Tenth day of May Eighteen hundred and Twenty one personally appeared before me a Justice of the Peace in and for the County aforesaid John Buehler and made oath on the Holy evangely of Almighty God that some time in the mounth [sic] of August eighteen hundred and foureteen [sic] while the British enemy lay in the River Patuxant [sic] that he the deponent see the Negroes of Mr. Peregrin [sic] Bowen by the names of Polly Grose, Mahaly, and Clarisy, and suppose them to be worth six Hundred dollars, they were [sic] with the British on there way to the shiping [sic] and verily [sic] beleaves [sic] they went on board.

at the same time [illegible] heard William Wood and made oath on the the holy evangely of Almighty God that he see the negroes of Mr. Bowen Polly Mahaly & Clarisy and suppose them to be worth at that time six Hundred dollars, with the British on there [sic] way on Board and he verily [sic] Beleaves [sic] that they did go on Board with them as they have never been in the neighbourhood since
